## **Naval Sailing Foundation**

The Foundation was organized in 1974 to facilitate the donation of boats, property, and cash that can be used for the benefit of the Navy Sailing program. At the present time, the Foundation has four boats on no-cost charters to NROTC Units, one chartered to an NJROTC Unit, nine chartered to MWRs, and three chartered to MCCS Units (otherwise known as Pendleton and Quantico). The Foundation has also chartered a sailboat to a branch to use for sail training and has donated sailboats to branches for sail training. The proceeds from the ultimate sale of these boats are used to keep the Navy Sailing Programs going. This sometimes means making grants to MWRs, Branches, NJROTC and NROTC Units.

## NAVSTA Roosevelt Roads

Even though the base facilities are not open, there is a small convenience store in the Marina Office, and they do have gasoline and diesel available at the fuel dock."

## CRUISING

We received an update from CAPTS Walt & Jane LeCompte, USN (Ret):

"In June of 2004 we headed out of the Mediterranean via the Red Sea and exited the bottom end in early September. From there we sailed to Oman and on to the Maldives. In early December 2004 we left the Maldives and sailed to Galle, Sri Lanka. It was a long and at times hard trip but also very interesting. We were in Galle when the tsunami hit – the good news is we were not hurt. The bad news is the boat was damaged. After doing temporary repairs to the boat we sailed to Phuket, Thailand, in mid-February. Arriving in Thailand in March 2005 we made arrangements for the permanent repairs. By September all the work was done and our boat was back in the water looking as good as new. We are now in Langkawi, Malaysia, and will base out of here for the next year or two exploring Southeast Asia."
